This warmly interactive performance for babies, families and friends celebrates music from around the world with a host of instruments, styles, gentle movements and stimulating sounds.

Performances feature harp, diatonic accordion, a range of stringed instruments, songs in different languages and lots lots more. We often theme the content around significant events, for example in January we will feature Chinese songs for Chinese New Year.

Seasonal show themes:

Spring Songs

A musical celebration of nature bursting into bloom.

Summer Sounds

A musical celebration of all things fresh, bright, sunny and summery.

Autumn Celebrations

Musical fireworks that spark joy and soothe, inspired by the festivals of the season.

Winter Warmers

A musical fest, with songs about bells, Kings and red red robins.



This is a rare opportunity for parents, carers and grandparents to attend a live concert with brilliant professional musicians, where babies are welcome to bounce, shout and crawl about. The event has a relaxed atmosphere designed to be flexible around you and your baby, with floor level seating (and chairs available), opportunities to join in, or just sit and relax and let the beautiful sounds of music from around the world wash over you and your baby. The performances are very relaxed with families invited to come and go, move around and feed babies as and when they need to.

Booking Details

Available for touring: Dates available throughout 2025/2026

No. of performers: 2
Total no. on the road: 3

Performance space: Performance area minimum 4.5m wide x 3m deep.

2 chairs for performers.

As the performance is for babies and their families we find it best to mainly seat audience on the floor with some chairs around the edge for those who need it. If a venue can provide

mats or cushions for people to sit on that's really helpful.

Outline Technical requirements: Basic wash lighting for indoor black box venues. We can be

very flexible in a space and do not require any technical

support, the performance is acoustic, unless it is a very large space or festival tent and large audience, and then we will

need a lapel mic for the singer.

Technical staff required: Basic lighting and sound support if in a theatre venue or large

space.

Get-in/ out: 2 hours get-in, 1 hour get-out

Running time: Concerts are usually half an hour, with up to half an hour

afterwards for audiences to meet the artists and the

instruments.

Number of shows a day: 1 or 2

Audience capacity: Dependent on venue, maximum 80 adults plus their babies.

Target audience: Babies aged 0-18 months plus their grown ups

The Night Shift is created by Fox & Rocha - the musicians behind BAM, and produced by Curiosity Productions.

We are excited to offer parents and carers a nocturnal companion as they tend to little ones through the night. Warm, magical and evocative podcast series The Night Shift combines captivating storytelling, vivid music and natural sonic landscapes, to create a space for escaping into the imagination. The spellbinding stories will keep you company and help you stay awake whilst feeding and soothing. Then nature sounds and original music are there to help you drift back off again.

Fox & Rocha have worked with writers Rochi Rampal and Emily Ayres, and carried out field recordings, often using contact microphones and hydrophones made by Jez Riley French; capturing the internal sonic worlds of trees, the gentle lapping of water, and other rustling, chirping, bubbling natural sounds. These were captured at the Birmingham & Black Country Wildlife Trust's haven and base, The Centre of the Earth, as well as other natural beauty spots across the UK and Portugal.

The BAM team are all experienced professionals, each with over 20 years experience in the industry. We have been delivering BAM concerts since 2017 and have a successful regular monthly concert at Midlands Arts Centre in Birmingham that regularly sells out two shows in one day with a capacity of 70 adults per show (plus babies).

BAM Performances are led by singer and harpist **Sam Frankie Fox** and multi-instrumentalist **Ricardo Santos Rocha** and the productions are supported by Curiosity Productions. Sam and Ricardo are very warm hosts as well as skilful musicians and Early Years specialists. Their combined experience and playful personalities ensure that events have an inviting, stimulating and relaxed atmosphere. Originally from Wales and Portugal, the BAM artistic directors are based in the Midlands and work locally, nationally and internationally. They love to perform music from across the globe, so every performance includes a rich variety of songs from different cultures (in a range of languages) and unusual and exciting instruments.

Beyond BAM, Fox and Rocha have a broad portfolio of live performance and recorded work, with projects having been presented at and with *Cheltenham Jazz Festival*, *The British Council Showcase* and *The Royal Shakespeare Company*. Biggest accolades include Fox's music being played on Jarvis Cocker's *Sunday Service* on BBC Radio 6 Music and Rocha's collaboration on the soundtrack of short animation film *Água Mole* (Drop by Drop) being presented at Cannes Film Festival 2017. Both also have extensive experience of working with children and adults with a range of disabilities and sensory impairments, and collaborate regularly with the charity *Sense*. *Suspended Motion*, a collaborative dance-film made with *Sense*, features their experimental musical work (scored to use *SubPac* technology), is currently being included within the official selections for a large number of international film festivals.
